
Why JTA?

Job Training Albuquerque (JTA) is the City of Albuquerque's premier workforce development program. JTA provides Albuquerque small businesses with an opportunity to skill up their employees by funding free training courses in high-demand skills.

JTA is a partnership between the City of Albuquerque and Central New Mexico Community College (CNM). Program funding is provided by the City's Economic Development Department and is administered by CNM Ingenuity (CNMI). Eligible trainings may be offered by any JTA Partner such as CNMI, the University of New Mexico, the New Mexico Child Care and Education Association, the Associated General Contractors of New Mexico, and Family Friendly New Mexico.


The City prioritizes workforce development as a strategy for economic growth. The EDD creates opportunities to skill up Albuquerque's workforce to match local employer demand, advance workers' careers, and generate higher wages.

JTA Reach: January 2020 to March 2023








